




"I am the father two children at the school, one in year 2 and one in year 6. I have been a governor since May 2009, initially at the Junior School only. However, I was a member of the Collaborative Committee that oversaw the move to a Primary School and in April 2013 commenced another 4 year term as Governor. I have been a member of all the committees of the governing body, but am currently on the finance committee. I am also the current Chair of the governing body."



"Head Teachers have the choice to be on the school's Governing Body or not. I have taken up the role of governor since starting at Holymead Infants (and at St Anne's Infants where I worked previously). When we merged to be a primary school I decided to continue as a governor. 
