School rules and expectations - please remember nail varnish and any other make-up should NOT be worn in school. Hair styles and hair accessories should be sensible and conducive to learning. Pupils should wear BLACK school shoes not trainers. Purple school sweat shirts are available on line through our website or

plain purple jumpers are available in shops. Socks and tights need to be black, white/cream or dark purple. No spots, stripes, patterns or other colours please.

RE and Citizenship: as part of being a Rights Respecting School we teach the children about a variety of different religions and cultures. JUBILEE POOL UNDER THREAT - Bristol City Council must save in excess of £100million during the next five years and is looking to make significant spending cuts which are likely to severely affect services across the city. As part of these cuts there is a proposal to scrap council funding for Jubilee Pool (making a saving of £62,000).

Jubilee Pool is a much-loved local resource. A great place to learn to swim, keep fit and enjoy time with family and friends, and in particular as you will be aware Holymead uses to teach children to swim from year 3 upwards. Swimming is a wonderful way to enjoy better physical and mental health, for all, not just the young.

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Rights Respecting Schools Article 13: Children have the right to get and to share information
