Dear Parents and Carers,



Camps-

Due to the on-going risks of cancellations by venues, residential sites closing down, and on-going staffing issues

relating to Covid, it has become too great a risk to book a camp for both Year 4 and Year 6. Therefore, for the foreseeable future the school will only be arranging a residential camp for Y6.

Y4 and Y5 have been enjoying a day trip to the Mendip Centre to do outdoor activities as these day excursions are more manageable if staff fall ill or other issues arise.



Staff are starting to prepare new class lists for next year. ALL the classes will be mixed up. We try to put children with a friend and split up those who don't work well together. This is a complex task as classes also need to remain balanced with even numbers of girls and boys of different abilities. Staff ask the children to name a couple of friends that they try to put them with <u>BUT IT IS NOT</u> <u>POSSIBLE TO GUARANTEE THAT YOUR CHILD WILL BE</u> <u>WITH ALL THEIR FRIENDS</u>.

We realise this can be an anxious time, usually more so for parents than children! We find the children are actually very adaptable and make new friends quickly in September so please don't worry.

By the time children get to Y4 or above, it may not be possible to meet everyone's historic requests for children to be apart or together. If a request was made to separate children eg in Y1, it may no longer be relevant to still keep those children apart in Y5, as relationships change. If you feel a historic request is still relevant more than a year on, please see your class teacher NOW to raise this.

School Uniform

Summer Uniform- summer dresses are purple or blue check. NO pink, yellow or any other colours.

Pupils may wear **black or grey** school shorts. Casual/sports shorts are **not** suitable for school wear, except on PE days.

Sensible sandals that hold a child's feet securely may be worn in fine weather. Sandals should be black, navy, dark purple or white- again **no** pink or other colours.

Please remember hair styles and accessories should be sensible and conducive to learning. Small bows and headbands are acceptable, large or sparkly ones get in the way and are distracting to others.



Open Day 12th July- the school invites current parents to look round both sites. This will be an opportunity to meet the teachers and look at the classrooms your child will be

moving to in September. The infant site will be open at 9.10- 10.00am and 1.15-2.00pm. Parents who have children currently in Key Stage 1 will be shown around by their children (please make sure they are registered first).

The junior site will be open at 10.00-11.00am and 2.00-2.45pm. Y6 ambassadors will be showing current parents round. Pupils in Key Stage 2 will need to stay in class (as Key Stage 2 learning is more structured and less fluid than learning in Key Stage 1).

The school will be open for 10-15 minutes after school to see your child's classroom for September.

I will be doing conducted tours for prospective parents on 13th July at 9.10am and 1.15pm on the infant site.



Summer Concert

After the restrictions of Covid-19, we are delighted to announce that our Summer Concert is back on this year! Our musicians and choir invite you to their Summer Concert in the Upper Hall on 6th July at 6.00pm-7.00pm. Please make sure your child is regularly practising their part at home. We look forward to hearing them perform in the concert.



School Reports will be sent out next week. Parents need to collect their reports in person or send a signed note naming a trusted adult to collect it on their behalf. Please can parents let the office know if a

second copy needs to be sent elsewhere. **Reception Reports (Foundation Stage)** - parents will receive their children's diaries, which contain comprehensive details of your child's achievements over the year. A short summary report is sent home to highlight your child's strengths and areas for development, which you can help with at home.

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 - parents will receive a report detailing their child's progress and achievements. There are targets which parents may be able to support their child with. There will be a **feedback sheet** enclosed with the reports, which needs to be signed and sent back to class teachers so we know you have received them. Attendance- please note that attendance is calculated in half days. So if the report shows 6 absences then your child has been off school for the equivalent of 3 days. This is because the register is called twice a day (once in the morning and once in the afternoon) so pupils get 2 possible attendance marks each day.



Congratulations to our Y1, Y2 and Y4 pupils who have worked really hard during the year to be able to complete the Y1 Phonic Check, the Y2 Phonic re-check and Y4 Multiplication Time table Check (MTC).

We are very proud of the 'can-do' attitude that our pupils have had towards these checks. These are good preparations for future exams as pupils become more resilient and confident in their own ability. Well done Y1, Y2 and Y4!



Shuffle up Day- on the afternoon of 7th July all children will shuffle up to their new classes to meet their new teachers. This includes Y2 going up to the juniors and new Reception children coming into school this year. 7th July is the day parent/carers are informed which class their children will be in. No changes to classes can be made once the class lists are put up on the doors so please talk to teachers NOW.

Y2 transition to Y3. As part of our transition programme to get children ready for Y3 we will be taking them to visit the junior site where they have a buddy to tell them what it is like in Key Stage 2.

We are also holding a short meeting with Y2 parents to welcome you to Y3 on the evening of 12th July at 3.45pm on the junior site. Children can attend and visit their new classrooms in Y3.



Sports Day - We have been looking into alternative dates and venues for KS2 Sports' Day. However, if we have to

hold our Sports' Day on our junior site, then we will have to limit how many parents can watch in the playground (1.7.22). Details to follow.
