Reminder. Please note the school does not accept any liability for items brought in from home including mobile phones and bikes. All items brought into school are brought in at the owner's risk. Parents and carers must sign the mobile phone agreement before letting their child bring a phone to school and the cycling to school agreement if they want their child to cycle.

Please remind your child they are not allowed to bring any toys or games including swapping cards and clip on toys on bags.



We are delighted that the Scholastic Book Fayre will be able to visit school from 6th May- 14th May. In a slightly different way to normal, we will only be allowing pupils to actually visit the book fayre. Due to the close proximity of browsing we are NOT inviting parents and carers inside the buildings but rather we'll send you the order form with the books via parentmail and you'll be able to select books with your child at home. As children will have been able to look through the books they should be able to point out their favourites in the booking form. If you need help please ask your class teacher or the office staff who will be happy to assist.

SATs –

No doubt parents and carers will have heard in the news that SATs and other primary testing is not going ahead this year.

This was the case last year too and as a school we undertook in-school assessments last year to be able to see where children were at in their learning. These were very informative and we intend to run similar assessments this year. We will share any outcomes with parents as part of the reporting process at the end of the year, so you know how your children are progressing.



The University of Bristol Research, CoMMinS project While vaccination protects the majority of people from serious illness, it is not known to what degree it will influence

transmission of Covid-19. This is a very important question that the CoMMinS study can help to answer if we keep collecting samples from vaccinated individuals. So we are continuing to run the saliva testing programme and encouraging staff and students to participate whether they have had a vaccination or not.

We are still looking for more volunteers to join the study and have opened it to include Y4 now so if your child is in Y2, Y4, Y5 or Y6 please refer to the email sent via ParentMail for further information and access to the online consent details for the CoMMinS study.

Governors' Corner by Ruth Clacey-Roberts (Vice Chair and Health and Safety Committee Chair): The school has now reopened to all pupils. Lots of work has been done to ensure that the transition back to school has been as smooth as possible. Lots of effort has been made to celebrate the fantastic achievements of all the children who were working from home, and who were in school, during the latest lockdown period, and some fabulous display boards have been put together to showcase examples of their work. You can see these on our website.

In the most recent Health and Safety Committee meetings we have reviewed the accident reporting system, which has recently changed to an on-line system. This seems to be working well and is becoming embedded in the school's practice. We were able to look at reports which that on-line system can generate to identify whether there are any patterns in the accidents which are occurring.

The school has sourced a new outside classroom at the infant site. The groundwork has all been completed and we are just waiting for delivery of the classroom. This will be a fantastic resource for the children and we all look forward to when it is operational. The school has also been successful in obtaining National Lottery Funding for work to be done on the upstairs of the Hub, which will eventually provide even more community space.

Jo Randall, who has been a governor at the school for about 10 years now, is stepping down from May and we would like to express our thanks to her for all she has contributed to the school over the years.

Travelling to School Policy

Rationale

Holymead Primary School is committed to promoting sustainable travel. walking, cycling or bus travel. We encourage staff and pupils to walk or cycle to and from school and to avoid car travel whenever possible. When car travel is necessary, we encourage families and staff to car-share and to park away from the school building so that a ten-minute walk is part of the journey to school. By encouraging families to park and stride, this makes the roads surrounding the school building safer for our parents and children as they are less congested. Pupils will also benefit as a short morning walk will help them to feel alert and ready to learn once they arrive in school.

Purposes

- Reduce congestion and car trips to school by pupils, parents, carers and staff
- Promoting Global Goals and looking after the environment by promoting sustainable travel
- Increase physical activity and an awareness of the importance of exercise for health among pupils, parents, carers and staff
- Improve the journey to school for pedestrians and cyclists

Guidelines

- Bike racks are provided for staff convenience.
- Pupils can have access to bike rack on the KS2 site providing parents or carers give consent for cycling to school.
- Bikeability course is run annually for Year 5/6 pupils to support them with bike and road safety when riding a bike to school.
- Road Safety Week and Walk to School Week is celebrated annually.
- All year groups take part in Road Safety Awareness programmes and activities, including assemblies, visitors and awareness days.
- Parents, carers and staff, who use similar routes to school, are encouraged to car share to reduce journeys.
- Those who cannot avoid using the car are encouraged to park away from school and walk the last ten minutes.
- Pupils learn about Global Goals, sustainability, how to care for the environment and healthy lifestyles in school.

Conclusion

All our initiatives will support our pupils to be fitter, healthier, more alert and ready to learn, as well as reducing the amount of traffic near our school.
