Governor news



The Full Governing Body met this week. They continue to monitor the budget, including Pupil Premium Funding, which can been found on

the school website. Governors are monitoring the work the school has been doing to provide remote learning during self-isolation. We are delighted to see so many children accessing Google Classrooms and See-saw. If you need help please ask your class teacher.

The University of Bristol is conducting research into how Covid-19 spreads in Bristol schools. It's a great study for children, as the tests are done through a saliva test, which does not cause any discomfort (unlike the standard swab test). Holymead Primary School is excited to be taking part in this study, which will be happening in the school on 19 and 20 January 2021. This research study will only be open to children in Y2 and Y5 and participation is completely voluntary. It will be up to parent/carers to decide whether they want their child included or not. Children who want to take part in the study will be invited to give a saliva sample which the study team will take away and analyse in the lab for Covid-19. The school will send out information to Y2 and Y5 parent/carers before the Christmas break, so you'll have time over the holidays to decide whether your child can take part in the study, and to sign up and give consent via the online system. Holidays in term time. It is very unlikely holidays will be authorised as circumstances have to be really exceptional. However, it is still important that applications are made

so there is a record in school. AS A GUIDELINE PARENTS SHOULD ASSUME APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR A HOLIDAY WILL NOT BE AUTHORISED AND YOU ARE LIKELY TO BE FINED FOR ANY UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE OVER 4 DAYS (8 SESSIONS).

Fines start at £60 per child, per responsible adult. For example, if you have 2 children in school and there are mum and dad sharing responsibility for the children then you will be fined £240. Fines rise if they are not paid on time. Please fill in a leave of absence form in advance of taking your children out. Note, you can still be fined if you take an unauthorised holiday but don't fill out a form.



Social distancing

Our school community has shown great consideration of others in wearing masks around school. Thank

you. Please can we extend that same consideration to others and maintain social distancing wherever possible around the surrounding area such as by the gates and on the pavements around school. We have a lot of people trying to get to and from both school sites and if parents congregate in groups near the school it can cause difficulty for others trying to get by.
