

School governance is very new to me. I have a day job running my own business and I've always

volunteered, but never in education. I've sat on a Service User Panel for a local healthcare provider, been a community champion for the NHS, and I'm currently mentoring five young marketers.

When I was looking for a new volunteering challenge the opening at the school came up. I live locally, so I decided it was the perfect opportunity to be able to offer my skills, to continue to be part of the community, and to also be part of our young people's development. I'm delighted to have been co-opted in November 2021 on to the CS&I committee. I'm also a link governor for Maths and Early Years.

I think people choose to become a governor for all sorts of reasons, but they all have the same role - to help with the school's strategic direction; to hold the senior team accountable; and to monitor finances. I'm really looking forward to getting to know the school, the pupils and the parents to help them achieve their goals.



Holidays in term time. It is very unlikely holidays will be authorised as circumstances have to be really exceptional. AS A GUIDELINE PARENTS SHOULD ASSUME APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE WILL NOT BE AUTHORISED AND YOU ARE LIKELY TO BE FINED FOR ANY UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE OVER 4 DAYS (8 SESSIONS).

Fines start at £60 per child, per responsible adult. For example, if you have 2 children in school and there are mum and dad sharing responsibility for the children then you will be fined £240. Fines rise if they are not paid on time.

Fines are not only issued for children being taken on holiday but can be given out when children are kept off school for 4 days or more without the head teacher's authorisation. PLEASE FILL IN A LEAVE OF ABSENCE FORM IN ADVANCE OF TAKING YOUR CHILD OUT.

The safeguarding link governor, Deb Miles, provided an update on safeguarding monitoring visits. Jessica Coggins, link governor for phonics, and Phil Wright, link governor for Pupil Premium, provided reports on their recent monitoring visits to the school. Dean Smart has been named as the new link governor for Health and Safety and Wellbeing. The Pupil Premium strategy, RSE Policy, Behaviour Policy and Equality Policy were reviewed approved by Governors.




