Spellings and Tables.

This year's KS2 Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG) results were well above the national average and we feel the support parents have given their children in learning their spellings has played an important part in making sure children are ready for these harder tests.

A letter has been sent home with every child to outline the spellings they need to practise over the summer. All children will be tested on their spellings in September. If, for whatever reason, your child hasn't got their spelling list in their book bag there are spelling lists on the school website. Please make sure your child practises their year group spellings. If they struggle then limit your child to one or two sections to go over and over. If they know them all then your child can learn the next year's list.



Times tables are also on the website for children to practise and learn off by heart. Keep returning to the lists regularly and testing your child. I can't

emphasise enough the difference knowing your times tables makes. It is those children who have learnt them that speed through their maths work in class.

There was a direct correlation between children who knew their times tables and those who did well in the KS1 and KS2 Maths tests.

The law has changed on holidays taken in term time. It is very unlikely holidays will be authorised

KS2 Fruit time

KS2 pupils are allowed to bring fresh fruit for break time. We are having problems with children going in and out of the building to get fruit (and other snacks) from their lunch boxes, when they should be outside in the playground. From now on fruit for break time must be brought directly into the classroom and not left in lunchboxes.

As there is also a problem with litter, children are only allowed to bring FRESH FRUIT for break time (preferably with no packaging) so waste can be dropped in the food bins. Children may continue to have any other sort of fruit or veg in their lunch box but can only eat it in the dinner hall where rubbish can be cleared away. Thank you.
