Dear Parents and Carers,



We are very excited to announce that our outdoor classroom is due to be delivered this Saturday morning at the infant site. Many of you will have been wondering why there is a slab of concrete up on

For many years our grass area has been under-used; one of the reasons being the inclement British weather and the other being the sound of 'can I go to the toilet?' the minute the class gets up the path to the grass, which inevitably leads to everyone coming back down again and little time is spent actually learning in the field. We are hopeful that having this base will mean classes can spend more time getting closer to nature both playing and as part of the curriculum.

SATs - No doubt parents and carers will have heard in the news that SATs and other primary testing is not going ahead this year.

This was the case last year too and as a school we undertook

in-school assessments last year to be able to see where children were at in their learning. These were very informative and we intend to run similar assessments this year. We will share any outcomes with parents as part of the reporting process at the end of the year, so you know how your children are progressing.

The University of Bristol Research, CoMMinS project

While vaccination protects the majority of people from serious illness, it is not known to what degree it will influence
