### **Governors' Corner**

Finance and Staffing Committee met and agreed the new budget for 2016-17. The way the government funds schools is changing to a national rather than local funding formula. Because Bristol had previously funded its schools very generously many Bristol schools are now losing out because of this government change. We have been luckier than many other schools and are able to set a balanced budget without losing staff so far.



**Caterlink-** following a tendering process our new providers for school dinners are Caterlink. Please note we are moving to a new cashless system for school dinners which will mean in future all payments must be made online and paid IN ADVANCE. No child will be able to have a dinner unless it is already paid for so please MAKE SURE YOUR ACCOUNT REMAINS IN CREDIT. We are expecting the new system to come into use from September.
