Behaviour, Equal Opportunities and Anti-Bullying Policies (See attached)

Whilst racist, homophobic and disablist bullying are rare at Holymead, we do still have to deal with some instances and every incident brings hurt to those on the receiving end. In response to these incidents, we have reviewed our policies to try and get across the message to everyone that any form of discrimination is unacceptable. Please read the Behaviour, Equal Opportunities and Anti-bullying policies attached, in particular the bits in red which show the action we will be taking if there is a discriminatory incident. Children who repeatedly or knowingly abuse others may have to work in the Link or library by themselves (supervised). This is known as internal suspension or seclusion and is an internal way of managing behaviour. It is not a formal suspension/exclusion. However, please note, repeat incidents or any severe incidents can also lead to formal suspension/exclusion. We will inform both sets of parents/carers and work with them. We expect parents/carers to engage with us to discuss the impact of these incidents on children and their families, and to improve future behaviour. We have spoken to the children and told them that it is not acceptable to use racist/homophobic/disablist or other discriminatory words and explained what the consequences will be if they do.

Holidays in term time. It is very unlikely holidays will be authorised as circumstances have to be really exceptional. However, it is still important that applications are made

so there is a record in school. AS A GUIDELINE PARENTS SHOULD ASSUME APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR A HOLIDAY WILL NOT BE AUTHORISED AND YOU ARE LIKELY TO BE FINED FOR ANY UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE OVER 4 DAYS (8 SESSIONS).

Fines start at £60 per child, per responsible adult. For example, if you have 2 children in school and there are mum and dad sharing responsibility for the children then you will be fined £240. Fines rise if they are not paid on time. Please fill in a leave of absence form in advance of taking your children out. Note, you can still be fined if you take an unauthorised holiday but don't fill out a form.
