In exceptional circumstances e.g. heavy snow or failure of heating systems we may need to close the school.



**Governors' Corner**: The finance governors met to monitor spending and check we are spending school finances appropriately. I can report all financial matters are up to date and follow correct procedures. The latest financial check has been submitted to the local authority in accordance

with policy and we have a reasonable carry forward which we are planning to spend on repair and maintenance jobs. We are currently in the process of renewing all the lighting in the classrooms on the junior site and painting some of the infant classrooms.



**JUBILEE POOL UNDER THREAT** - Bristol City Council must save in excess of £100million during the next five years and is looking to make significant spending cuts which are likely to severely affect services across the city. As part of these cuts there is a proposal to scrap council funding for Jubilee Pool (making a saving of £62,000).

Jubilee Pool is a much-loved local resource. A great place to learn to swim, keep fit and enjoy time with family and friends, and in particular as you will be aware Holymead uses to teach children to swim from year 3 upwards. Swimming is a wonderful way to enjoy better physical and mental health, for all, not just the young.



A head of steam is building up behind the campaign to Save Jubilee Pool, which apart from the those who have stepped forward to help 'Save Jubilee Pool from Closure', from the councils perspective, support is being led by Knowle Cllrs Gary Hopkins and Chris Davies and strongly supported by Brislington Cllr Jos Clark and campaigner Andrew Varney.

Jubilee Swimming Pool was threatened with closure over 5 years ago when Labour and Tory Councillors agreed that the provision of the new Hengrove Pool was all that was needed in this part of Bristol.

A demonstration took place on Saturday 18th, which was well attended, but we need to make sure the council have the view of as many people in the BS4 locality and whose children attend Holymead Primary School.
