Where a car is parked dangerously, if parents/carers send photos to the school office of the car's number plate (not the drivers) then we will send these on to the police. (Obviously it saves on school time if you send photos directly to the above address). Please include the date, time and place that you took the photo. The school will not get involved in disputes that arise between parents over parking, as parking is a highways and police matter and not the school's responsibility. It is a matter for the police whether they decide to take action or not over any photos forwarded to them.

The school will not tolerate any abuse or threatening behaviour from parents and carers towards staff or others and will report this to security who may take action to ban parents/carers from the school sites, or where appropriate we will report this to the police. Please park legally and safely.

**Child Safety** - As in previous years anyone performing in plays/concerts may be photographed by parents during the performance and whilst we hope parents will be mindful of where they put photos of children, the school has no say in where photos end up. If you don't want your child in any photos, then they cannot perform in the play and we will make arrangements for them to stay with another year group during the performances so they are safe.

Dear Parents/ Careers,

Recently your child's school have chosen to participate in a parking incentive in partnership with Avon and Somerset Police. The aim of the incentive is to educate parents and offer an alternative safer place to park during the school run.

The local beat team will be conducting regular patrols during drop off and pick up times. We will speak to any offender vehicles and where applicable, tickets will be issued. Staff at the school will also be reporting back to myself of any vehicles which have been caught parking illegally or dangerously on a number of occasions. These vehicles will be receiving a letter from myself educating them on the potential implications of their parking.

'It is an offence to wilfully cause an obstruction in any public footpath or public thoroughfare, (section 28 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1828).'

'It is an offence to stop a vehicle within pedestrian crossing limits of Zebra / Puffin crossing, (Contrary paragraph 1, Part 5, Schedule 14 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016, section 25(5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988)

I want to thank all the parents/careers who already do park sensibly, which I know is the vast majority. But can I please encourage all parents/careers to also engage in the incentive by reporting the registration plate of any offending vehicle directly to your child's school. By working together we can make it a safer place for all the pupils of the school.
