WAS YOUR CHILD BORN BETWEEN 1<sup>st</sup> SEPTEMBER 2013 AND 31<sup>st</sup> AUGUST 2014? If they were, you need to be putting your child's name down at the school you wish them to attend in September 2018. If you know of friends with nursery age children please check they have applied online to the local authority. Even if you have older children at this school you must still apply for a reception place using the online Bristol form. Thank you.

Holidays in term time. It is very unlikely holidays will be authorised as circumstances have to be really exceptional. AS A GUIDELINE PARENTS SHOULD ASSUME APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE WILL NOT BE AUTHORISED AND YOU ARE LIKELY TO BE FINED FOR ANY UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE OVER 4 DAYS (8 SESSIONS). Fines start at £60 per child, per responsible adult. For example if you have 2 children in school and there are mum and dad sharing responsibility for

the children then you will be fined £240. Fines rise if they are not paid on time. Fines are not only issued for children being taken on holiday but can be given out when children are kept off school for 4 days or more without the head teacher's authorisation. PLEASE FILL IN A LEAVE OF ABSENCE FORM IN ADVANCE OF TAKING YOUR CHILD OUT.

**Children's cycle coaching at the Family Cycling Centre** -The Bristol Family Cycling Centre in Hengrove offers cycle coaching for children aged 7 to 12, led by a British Cycling-qualified coach. This is in addition to the range of learn-to-ride, disabilityfriendly and family sessions that take place at the Centre.

The coaching sessions improve bike handling skills using fun games and are suitable for those wishing to get more confident on their bike ready for independent riding on the roads as well as would-be racers.

The sessions are run on our traffic-free space. Children can bring their own bike or use one of the Centre's.

Sessions take place most Saturday mornings.

• Session 1 (9.10 to 9.55 am) for those aged 7-12 who have not done any coaching before to master a range of bike handling skills. Children need to be able to ride already. £3.50 per child (£2 for those eligible for free school meals).

• Session 2 (10-11am) for those aged 8-12 who are very confident bike handlers. £5 per child (£2.50 for those eligible for free school meals).
