

Please note the school tries to pass on information it considers may be helpful or of interest to parents in this newsletter. We do not necessarily endorse or check the security and safety of the services on offer. Parents need to satisfy themselves that they are happy to leave their children at any of the clubs and services advertised which are not based on the Holymead School sites. Holymead School carries out DBS checks on clubs who have hire agreements with this school.

The law has changed on holidays taken in term time. It is very unlikely holidays will be authorised as circumstances have to be really exceptional. AS A GUIDELINE PARENTS SHOULD ASSUME APPLICATIONS FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE WILL NOT BE AUTHORISED AND YOU ARE LIKELY TO BE FINED FOR ANY UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE OVER 4 DAYS (8 SESSIONS). Any suspicious absence will be investigated.





**Summer Uniform**- summer dresses are purple or blue check. NO pink, yellow or any other colour. Pupils may wear **black or grey** school shorts. Casual/sports shorts are **not** suitable for school. Sensible sandals that hold a child's feet securely may be worn in fine weather. Sandals should be black, navy, dark purple or white- again **no** pink or other colours. Please remember hair styles and accessories should be sensible and conducive to learning. Small bows are acceptable, large ones get in the way. Pupils should NOT wear trainers.

The Year 1 Phonics Check and Y2 re-check will be administered in the week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> June.



**KS1 SATs** - Y2 are undertaking statutory assessments in May. We don't make a big deal of SATs at this age and children don't usually notice much difference

to normal work. Generally pupils have a reading booklet, a maths' booklet and some writing to do. The work done in a test format is only used to support what teachers already know about your child by working with them all year. A disaster on one booklet due to your child having a headache etc that day will not affect the outcomes that are awarded. Outcomes are given to parents at the end of the school year.

It is therefore essential that Year 1 and Year 2 children are in school during these weeks so any requests for holiday/leave of absence during this period will not be authorised. If you need to attend a funeral or have an unexpected emergency during this time please see me or ring school immediately. Thank you.



We are very pleased to announce that over the holidays there was some new playground equipment installed in the junior site playground. The money was part funded by the school and part by the Friends' Group. Please note the equipment is for use during school time only and children should not be playing on it before or after school. Thank you.

Children were able to view the plans before the final decision was made and helped to choose which apparatus they preferred. We therefore expect ALL children to respect this equipment and use it properly.



## Friends' Activities -Coin Line
