The school office is open from 8.40am if you need to call in. Please do not wait inside the buildings before or after school unless you are queuing for the office.

**School Uniform.** We have moved to all uniform being ordered online. We stock different sizes of sweat shirts etc so you can try on a sample to get the right size before ordering. If you don't have internet access our office staff

are happy to help you with ordering uniform.

**Polo Shirts:** These can either be plain white or dark purple in colour.

**Shoes:** Children need to have BLACK SCHOOL SHOES for school. NO TRAINERS! Thank you.

PLEASE NOTE JEANS AND **HOODED PURPLE TOPS** ARE NOT SCHOOL UNIFORM AND MUST NOT BE WORN IN SCHOOL

**PE kit:** is a purple tee-shirt and black shorts in a purple dap bag. Black or white tee shirts and shorts are an acceptable alternative but no club football kits etc. ALL UNIFORM, INCLUDING PE KITS MUST BE LABELLED CLEARLY.

**Back Packs** are not allowed on the infant site as space is very limited.

**Pencil Cases:** just a reminder that pupils are NOT allowed to bring pencils and pencil cases to school. The only exception to this is in Y6 where pupils are getting ready for using their own pencil cases and equipment in secondary school.



Reminder- 'Holidays in term time are not normally authorised.' 'Penalty Notices (fines) may be used where absence is unauthorised,' Education Welfare Service.

Several fines were issued last year for unauthorised holidays. Holidays need to be taken in school holidays not during term time. Please follow the school policy on the website and make sure you fill in a leave of absence form.

If you have an exceptional reason for needing to take your child out of school during term time you will need to fill in a leave of absence form from the office stating the exceptional reason eg to see a terminally ill grandparent or attend a close relative's wedding. These will be kept as evidence should a penalty notice or court case ensue.

Please note requests for taking children out of school for exceptional reasons must be made in advance of taking children out. Leave of absence cannot be authorised after you return and therefore will be marked as unauthorised. 4 days (8 half days) of unauthorised absences can mean a penalty notice (fine) is issued. Currently this is £60 per child, per adult. For example 2 parents taking 2 children could mean a fine of £240.

# Spellings and Tables.

All children will be tested on their spellings this term.



If, for whatever reason, your child hasn't got their spelling list in their book bag there are spelling lists on the school website. Please make sure your child practises their year group spellings. If they struggle then limit your child to one or two boxes to go over and over. If they know them all then your child can learn the next year's list.



Times tables are also on the website for children to practise and learn off by heart. Keep returning to the lists regularly and testing your child. I can't

emphasise enough the difference knowing your times tables makes. It is those children who have learnt them that speed through their maths work in class.

## **Rules and Safety**

As the new school year starts I would like to inform parents about some of the rules around school.



Bikes and scooters and any other wheeled transport may not be ridden in

the school grounds. We have found it is too dangerous to allow children of any age to use wheeled transport round school. Scooters must be taken home, not left in school, as we do not have the capacity to store them. Children in Upper KS2 (Y5 and 6) may park bikes in the bike sheds if parents fill in the cycling to school agreement. Bikes are left at their owner's risk.

Climbing Equipment is not for use by children before or after school hours on either site.

**Dogs** are not allowed on the school premises at all. Even if you know they are gentle pets a small child can still find them threatening.

The white lines on the infant site are painted round the playground to keep your children safe. Please remind your children they are not allowed to go up the grass banks or the new path or the concrete slopes before or after school. This includes pre-schoolers as playing in these areas can be dangerous.

Drains and drain covers - There are many drains and drain covers around school which mean there are many holes so please be careful if you wear stilettos or narrow heeled footwear as narrow heels can go through the holes.

**Toys, games, pencil cases, mobile phone phones** etc are not allowed in school as they can cause arguments and lead to problems.



#### Friends' Events:

**Coffee morning** 23<sup>rd</sup> September- for all parent/carers to particularly welcome new parent/carers to school. After drop off in the infant hall. YR to Y6 parents are welcome to come and have coffee and chat. Pre-schoolers are welcome to come and play. (All donations to MacMillan Cancer Support).

**Friends' Meeting** 9<sup>th</sup> September after drop off. New members always welcome.

**AGM 13**<sup>th</sup> **October 9am in the junior library- calling all parents in both KS1 and KS2 (infant and junior sites).** We always need new members to keep joining the Friends' Group and get involved in organising social and fund raising events. We will be looking for new people to help by taking up positions in the group to ensure it runs smoothly. Support is always on hand. Meetings are held during and after school on the infant and junior sites and pre-schoolers are welcome.

#### **KS2 Fruit time**

KS2 pupils are allowed to bring fresh fruit for break time. We have had problems with children going in and out of the building to get fruit (and other snacks) from their lunch boxes, when they should be outside in the playground so from now on fruit for break time must be brought directly into the classroom and not left in lunchboxes.

As there is also a problem with litter, children are only allowed to bring FRESH FRUIT for break time (preferably with no packaging) so waste can be dropped in the food bins.

Children may continue to have any other sort of fruit or veg in their lunch box but can

only eat it in the dinner hall where rubbish can be cleared away. Thank you. **KS1** continue to have free fruit provided by the government.



**ParentMail:** Please can we remind parents/carers that everyone should have now re-registered onto the new ParentMail platform (which has been recently updated by parentMail). This will allow the school to send out school news electronically (via email) and will also allow for the majority of payments to the

school to be made online and allow us to be as cashless as possible. Thank you for your patience whilst we embed the new process.
