The Year 1 and Y2 (re-test) Phonics Check will be administered in the week beginning 11th June.





Attendance

You probably won't be surprised to hear that attendance at school correlates closely to children's success at GCSEs. In

their previous learning children need to be in school regularly.

To encourage this we are trialling an attendance reward system. This will start in Y3 and Y4 this term with 100% attendance certificates being given out for pupil attendance each TERM (therefore if a child is off for an illness one term they can still get the 100% certificate the next term). There will also be a certificate for Improved Attendance for pupils who have made a noticeable improvement in attendance according to data from SIMs (our attendance recording system).

Whilst the 'improved attendance' is based on figures it is not as clear cut as 100% and therefore we welcome polite feedback from parents. I will be making judgements such as 'this child doesn't really deserve the Improved Attendance Certificate this term because the reason they've improved is because they went on a 2 week holiday last term!' It is more judgemental. If we get complaints that it's not fair then we will take that into consideration when we review the trial and decide whether to continue with these certificates or not.

Summer Uniform- summer dresses are purple or blue check. NO pink, yellow or any other colour. Pupils may wear **black or grey** school shorts. Casual/sports shorts are **not** suitable for school. Sensible sandals that hold a child's feet securely may

be worn in fine weather. Sandals must be black, navy, dark purple or white- again **no** pink or other colours.

Please remember hairstyles and accessories such as hats should be sensible and conducive to

learning. Small bows are acceptable, large ones get in the way.

Pupils should NOT wear trainers.

Sunglasses get broken very easily so they are not allowed in school except for medical reasons. Parents need to write a brief note to the teacher explaining the reason. Thank you.
