Dear Parents and Carers,



Staff are starting to prepare new class lists for next year as ALL the classes will be mixed up. We try to put children with a friend and split up those who don't work well together. This is a complex

task as classes also need to remain balanced with even numbers of girls and boys of different abilities. Staff ask the children to name a couple of friends that they try to put them with <u>BUT IT IS NOT POSSIBLE TO GUARANTEE</u> <u>THAT YOUR CHILD WILL BE WITH THEIR FRIENDS</u>. If you want to speak to teachers it is best to approach them now rather than later. I realise this can be an anxious time, usually more so for parents than children! We find the children are actually very adaptable and make new friends quickly in September so please don't worry. Making new friends is an important life skill and we find moving the children round can balance friendship groups better.

Roads around school sites.

Parents please think about the safety of our children when driving and parking around school.

Please don't park on the zig zags.

We have put out parking signs and we've rung the police to come and monitor dangerous driving and parking around school. If you see dangerous driving and parking, please report it to:

DO NOT send your child to school if **anyone in the household is waiting for the results of a Covid test.** Further advice is available online.





Holymead Primary School's Runathon raises over £7,000 for local foodbank

Holymead Primary School in Brislington, Bristol has raised over £7000 for South and East Bristol foodbank. The money was raised by our families and people in the local community sponsoring pupils to participate in a runathon. The event, which was run by the school's Rights Action Group, was held throughout May. The idea for the event was suggested by pupils who wanted to help local families who may have fallen on hard times as a result of the coronavirus pandemic.

South and East Bristol foodbank provide nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people who are in crisis. They are part of a nationwide network of foodbanks, supported by The Trussell Trust, working to combat poverty and hunger across the UK.

Fundraising is a top priority for Holymead Primary School who have recently been reaccredited with the Gold Rights Respecting Schools' Award. The Rights Respecting Schools Award is granted to schools that show commitment to promoting and realising children's rights and encouraging adults, children and young people to respect the rights of others. Gold is the highest accolade given by Unicef UK and shows a deep and thorough commitment to children's rights at all levels of school life.

Headteacher of Holymead Primary School, Kate Slatcher, said: We are proud that our pupils have been so enthusiastic about raising money for others. I think the community has really got behind this fundraising event because they recognise the important role that foodbanks have played during these uncertain times. As staff will be moving around (in September) I think they would be dismayed to think parents considered a change of age range as a promotion or demotion. It is not. This is simply part of the cycle of moving around and keeping staff up to date with ways of teaching in all the age ranges.

No changes to classes can be made once the class lists are put up on the doors so please talk to teachers NOW.

Y2 transition to Y3. As part of our transition programme to get children ready for Y3 we will be taking them to visit the junior site where they have a buddy to tell them what it is like in Key Stage 2.

We are also holding a short meeting with Y2 parents to welcome you to Y3 on the evening of 13th July at 5pm on the junior site. Please wear masks.



SATs - No doubt parents and carers will have heard in the news that SATs and other primary testing is not going ahead this year.

This was the case last year too and as a school we undertook

in-school assessments last year to be able to see where children were at in their learning. These were very informative and we intend to run similar assessments this year.

We will share any outcomes with parents as part of the reporting process at the end of the year, so you know how your children are progressing.
